Treasurer's Report

Treasurers Update:

Recently, I received a request from a few members about the current status of the club's finances. While I do give a financial report at the business meeting each month, I realize that many members cannot attend frequently and therefore do not get to here that information. This is a general overview of the club's finances, and plans on both investment and future expenditures.

History:

The RNA is currently supported by about 120 paying accounts, including both individual and family accounts. Receipts from the membership average about \$1800 per year that covers expenses associated with holding meetings and mailing newsletters. A separate coin show account holds receipts from our annual show. Those funds are transferred to the Treasurer and used each year to pay for the Presidential medals.

The club has a regular savings account with about \$2100 in it, and checking of about \$3000. The Board has since directed me to determine if there are other options for the club's money to earn a higher rate of return. In addition, after member John Jay Pittman died, his family made a very generous \$10,000 contribution to the club. In gratitude, the club designated our library as the John Jay Pittman Memorial Library. Over time, the money has been invested in 6 month CD's earning anywhere from 3% to 5% and has since increased to about \$12,000.

On top of those receipts listed above, members pay to attend the annual banquet, and picnic - about \$30 total for both events. The club does subsidize both of those events to a certain degree. We also rely on the generosity of members who donate food and other services.

Where We're Going:

In order to provide members the biggest bang for the buck, the board is considering other events for upcoming

program years. First, there has been discussion about bringing in a nationally recognized speaker. The total cost of flying someone up, a hotel room, dinner, breakfast, etc., was about \$400 - which most club members I spoke to thought was a reasonable way to spend club money. We also recently made a major acquisition for the club's collection - a 1793 Chain Cent - for about \$1500. There has also been some discussion about doing a trip to a Coin Show for the Junior Club, chartering a bus, lunch, etc. There are also several other events being considered that members will learn about soon.

We also recently spent some dollars on developing a club web site. The design was free - Scott Fybush and myself have done all the programming. However, there are still marginal costs associated with hosting the site. If you haven't done so already, check out www.the-rna.com.

Looking out even further, Scott Fybush and myself, along with the Greater Rochester Visitors Association have been working to bring an ANA Convention to Rochester in either the spring or summer of 2012. The year will mark the 100th Anniversary of the RNA's founding, the 100th Anniversary of the ANA Convention in Rochester, and the 65th Anniversary for the RJNA. A letter has been sent to Edward Rochette, ANA Executive Director, expressing our interest in hosting the convention in 2012.

While 2012 is many years away, we feel it is important to get onto the calendar now, and secure that important date. Currently the ANA has made commitments to 2007, so now is the time to lay the foundation for hosting the convention. More details are to come, including a reprint of the letter sent to Mr. Rochette.

So, all in all, I feel pretty good about the direction of the club. I hope I haven't bored you with all these details! Let me know if you have any other questions by writing me at the club address or by e-mail at davidg@rmychamber.com.

90th Anniversary Medal Available Soon

Our club has a long tradition of special medallic issues, and our ninetieth anniversary this year is no exception.

Club member Gerry Muhl coordinated production of the RNA 90th anniversary medal, which features a design with a long history.



The medal shown above was designed by Alphonse A. Kolb for the RNA's 700th meeting, on March 2, 1943.

Because of wartime shortages of materials, it was never issued, and exists only as a unique bronze in the club collection.

At Gerry's suggestion, the RNA chose to use a modification of this design for our 90th anniversary medal, thus completing the design process that began nearly sixty years ago.



This is a rough sketch of the medal, which is expected to be made available at the February 12 meeting.

60 examples will be struck in silver (\$12), 35 in silver-plated bronze (\$6), 35 in gold-plate bronze (\$6.50) and 35 in platinum-plated bronze (\$7.50).

A complete set of four medals is priced at \$30.

The club also recently acquired the transportation token collection of longtime member Doug Borden.


We are grateful to him for that collection, which includes one of the most comprehensive sets known of Rochester material.

CLUB NEWS

The Rochester Numismatic Association (RNA), one of America's oldest, continuously operating coin clubs, hosted its 29th annual coin show on November 3-4, 2001, at the Eisenhart Auditorium of the Rochester Museum and Science Center in New York. The well-attended event attracted more than 30 dealers specializing in all areas of the hobby.

Dating back to the presidency of William Howard Taft, the RNA was founded on a cold winter's evening in January 1912. Its first meeting attracted 15 dedicated coin collectors. Today, its membership has grown to

more than 100 loyal hobbyists. Months after its inception, the RNA joined the American Numismatic As-

sociation, becoming the ANA's second member club.

The highlight of the RNA's No-

vember coin show was "Origins of the United States Quarter," a traveling exhibit sponsored by the Professional Numismatists Guild (PNG). The display gives a general overview of the history of U.S. coinage, as well as background information on the Mint's 50 State Quarters™ Program. The exhibit made its debut at the ANA World's Fair of Money® in August 2001 in Atlanta, Georgia.

- The club will support Gerry Muhl's nomination to the Citizens' Commemorative Coin Advisory Committee, which works with the Congressional Banking Committees in proposing bills to create new commemorative coins.
 - The board approved a \$1500 expenditure to acquire a 1793 Chain cent for the RNA collection.
